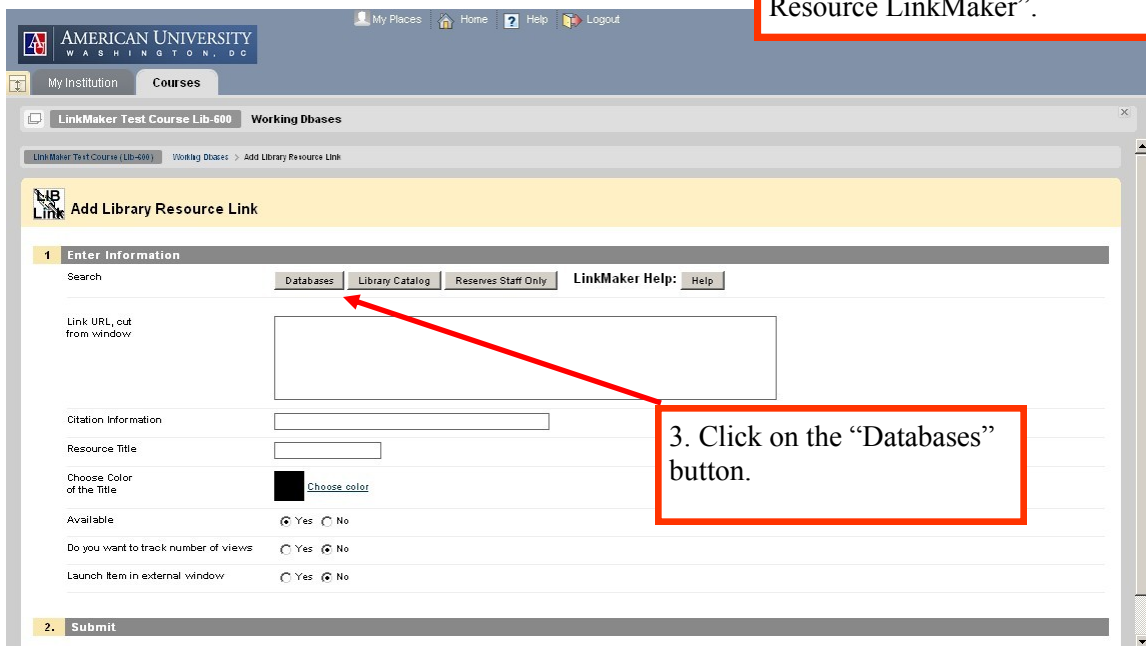
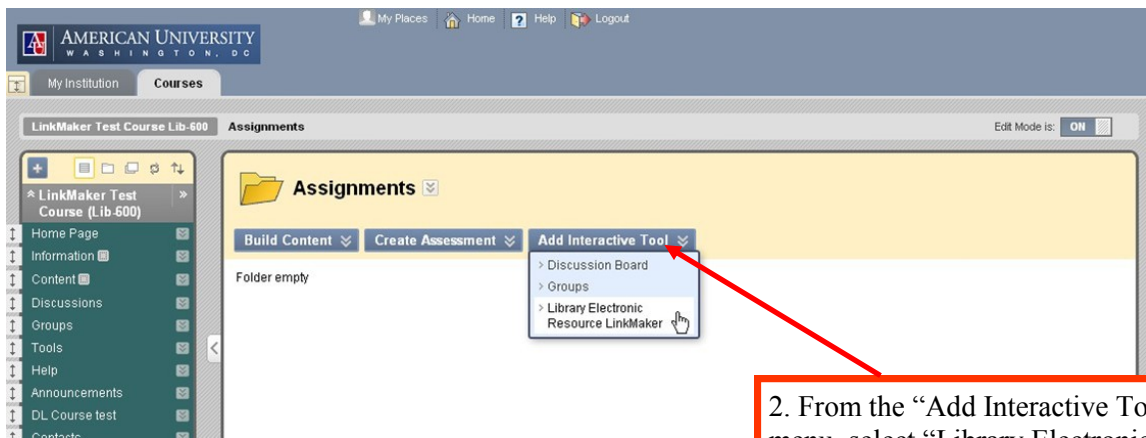
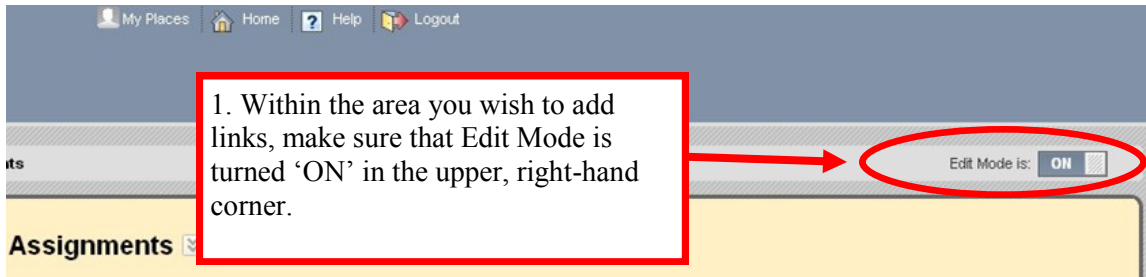


Using Blackboard's LinkMaker program with *HeinOnline*



- [Grove Music Online \(Oxford Music Online\)](#)
Access to Oxford Music Online 3 concurrent users. Oxford Music Online is an integrated music resource on the web, including the full text of The New Grove Dictionary of Music and Musicians (second edition; 29 volumes), The New Grove Dictionary of Opera (4 volumes), The New Grove Dictionary of Jazz (second edition; 3 volumes), The Oxford Dictionary of Music (second edition), and The Oxford Companion to Music.
- [HeinOnline Law Journal Library](#)
A comprehensive collection of full-text PDF (or text) images of major law journal articles, including back issues.
- [Historical Abstracts \(EBSCO\)](#)
Bibliographic database covering the world's scholarly literature in history, excluding the United States and Canada. Equivalent to the printed version of Historical Abstracts.
- [History Cooperative](#)
Full text to over 20 scholarly history journals.
- [Human Resources Abstracts](#)
Human Resources Abstracts includes bibliographic records covering management, employee assistance, organizational behavior, and other Human Resources, Human Resource Management, and Human Resources.

Contains detailed reports on over 700 industries in the United States. Reports are based on the NAICS code.

Offers full-text access to 20 IEEE Computer Society Periodicals, plus more than 875 conference proceedings.
- [IIMP: International Index to Music Periodicals Full Text](#)
This index of 370 international music periodicals includes over 60 full text titles. The index also contains retrospective coverage of 185 periodicals with articles dating from as far back as 1874. The emphasis of the database ranges from scholarly music research to popular articles on recent trends.
- [IIPA: International Index to the Performing Arts Full Text](#)
This index of about 210 periodicals covers the variety of performing arts including dance, film, television, theater, and related subjects. As of Summer 2003, 36 of the periodicals contain full text articles back to 1998.



SIR: You are probably aware that the commission appointed some time ago, under the chairmanship of Admiral Walker, to examine into the subject of the Nicaragua canal is approaching the completion of its labors and will soon be ready to report. They have gone into the subject with more care, patience, and accuracy than any preceding body which has examined it, and it is to be hoped that when the report is presented it will contain the elements for a final decision of the material problems involved. There is also a bill before the Senate, the result of great pains and research, which, if accepted by both branches of Congress, will open the way for the Government of the United States to take a more efficient part in the execution of this great enterprise than has hitherto been practicable. At the same time there is a growing conviction throughout the country that some definite action of the Government of the United States has now become necessary if the labors of the past are to be made useful and the linking of the Atlantic and the Pacific Oceans by a practicable waterway is to be realized. The events of the past year have made it more than ever necessary that some means of communication between the Atlantic and the Pacific should be at once accom-


