
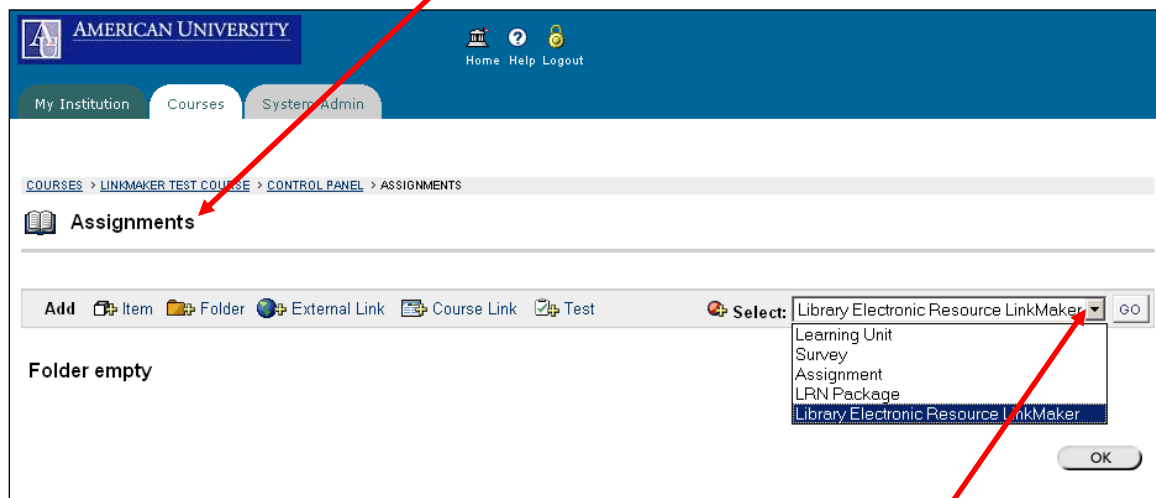


Using BlackBoard's LinkMaker program with *IngentaConnect* titles



1. Library Electronic Resource LinkMaker can be accessed through Blackboard's Control Panel in the various Content Areas. This help document demonstrates LinkMaker within the Assignments content area.

Abstract:
 The rational and political decision models are developed and tested for the land rural China. A novelty of the test is to link the collective decision with general resource scarcities. Competing hypotheses are developed for the two models and tested on data collected on 83 Chinese villages. The results show that neither model is strongly supported, but the political model fares slightly better in more sophisticated econometric testing. The results also show that popular political participation is emerging in Chinese villages. Implications of this land policy are discussed.
