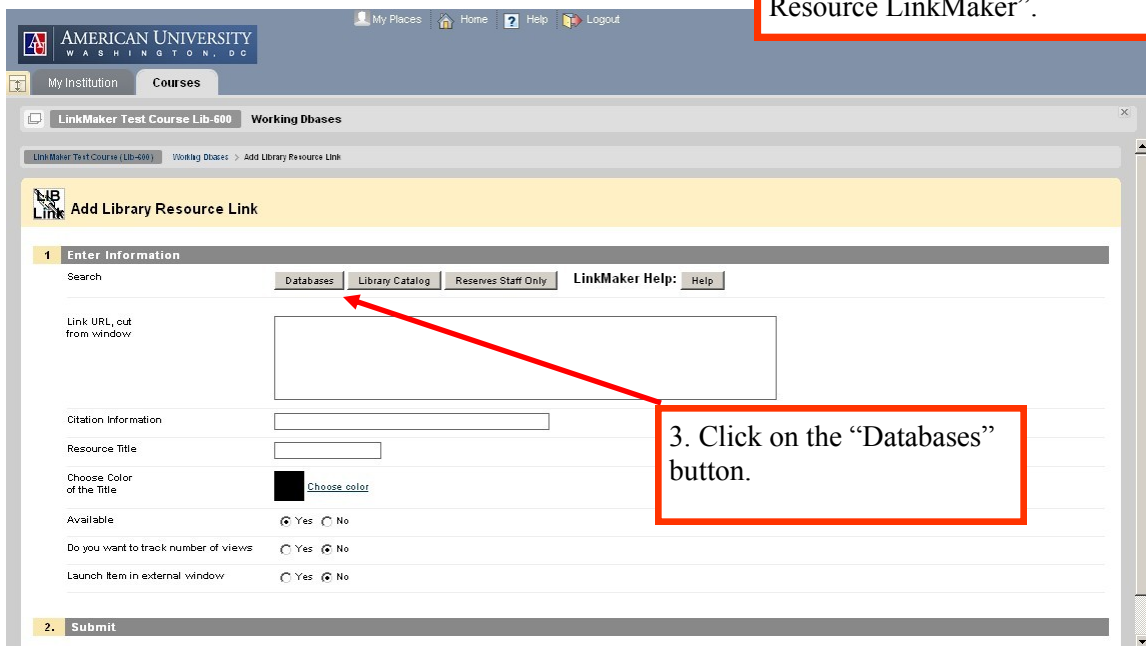
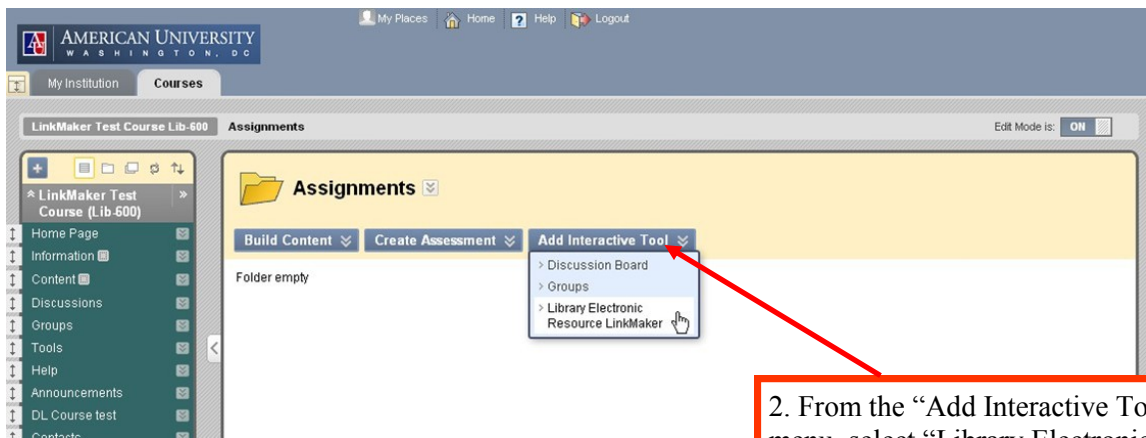
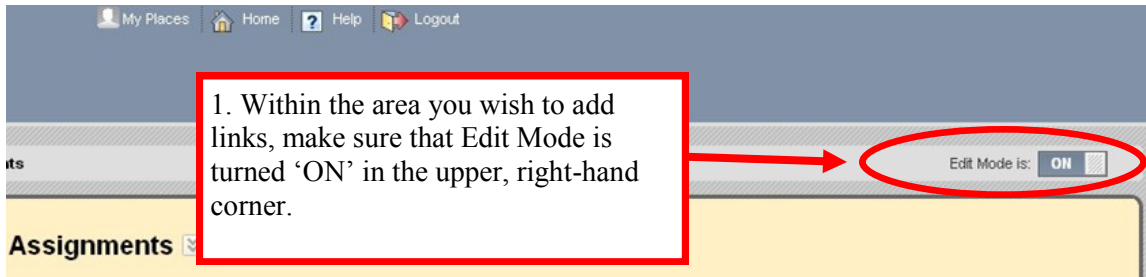


Using Blackboard's LinkMaker program with *Wall Street Transcript*
